Thad tells the story of his first guitar: *“Under the tree, wrapped in white tissue paper and tied with red ribbon was a long cardboard box containing a guitar bought from the*

local department store for \$13.97. The strings were so far off the frets it took a pair of vice grips to make any discernible musical sounds. A year and 52 guitar lessons later I could play Aura Lee and Amazing Grace and had the grip of a journeyman mechanic.” When I heard him play at Songbird Sanctuary a while back, I concluded he must still have a pretty good grip, to do all those two-finger picking things up and down the fretboard. In addition to being a wonderful songwriter, Thad is an extraordinary guitarist, having recorded guitar tracks for Tom Russell on three albums and played backup for the likes of B. B. King, Emmylou Harris, The Band, and many others.

As a songwriter he has written and produced seven solo albums. His latest CD, **Streets of Disaster** received critical acclaim from Jerry Garcia biographer and *Acoustic Guitar Magazine* music reviewer Blair Jackson: “Beckman has released a knockout album with lots of stylistic variety. This is powerful stuff, beautifully performed and exquisitely produced. Quite a find!” and Tom Russell: “One of America’s best guitar players, and a damn good songwriter.”

Thad has appeared on *The David Letterman Show*, the main stage at Kerrville, Levon Helm’s *Midnight Ramble*, and countless other festivals, theatres and clubs across the U.S.A., Canada, and Europe. This will be a highly memorable evening with a top-level, accomplished professional. Be sure to put this one on your calendar!

"Woody Sez: The Life and Music of Woody Guthrie"

I grew up listening to some of Woody Guthrie's music without knowing their authorship, such as "Oklahoma Hills," and "Put Your Finger in the Air." I got my first full album of Guthrie's Dust Bowl Ballads when I was fourteen, and his Library of Congress recordings at the age of 15.

It's nice to know that some young musicians and actors are carrying on his musical legacy in such productions as "Woody Sez," a combination of phases of Woody's life and philosophy done in a revue format at Stages Repertory Theater.

The play is a musical biography covering important parts of Woody's journey, such as the loss of his sister, mother, and father, his controversial conflicts on his radio programs that eventually cost him more exposure, his experiences in the Merchant Marines with Cisco Houston and Jimmy Longhi, his fierce hatred of fascists and vigilantes, and his unfortunate struggle with Huntington's Chorea that eventually caused his death.

The young thespians who portray Woody and the influential people in his life show a true passion and enthusiasm for his legacy. Ben Hope, as Guthrie, does the most powerful rendition of "Dust Storm Disaster" and "Deportees" I have ever heard. Spiff Wiegand, (aka "Spiffy") does a great job as Pete Seeger, Cisco Houston, and Jimmy Longhi, who were some of Woody's important cohorts. Kate Barton and Megan Loomis provide some excellent background music and also do very well as the women who took influential parts in his life.



There was a hootenanny after the show, led by the actors. It featured a great variety of musical instruments, such as congo drum, a saxophone, as well as the usual folk instruments of guitars, banjos, and mandolins. Paul Cooper, Carolyn Davis, Bob Pangle, and I enjoyed playing and singing. However, perhaps the highlight of the hoot was a one-man percussion band--that's the only way I can describe it. A good time was had by all.



If you love Woody, I highly recommend seeing this play. However, I think by the time this review comes out, the Houston run will end. I hope it will come back very soon. Until then, "Take it easy, but take it." It's well worth the wait.

The Iconic Songs of World War II

Recently in a conversation with an 84 year old musician, William Beier, he was telling me about some of the memorable music of the World War II era. William speaks with fondness for the music of this time and of those who performed it. A

google search list of the iconic songs of the times may have from 15 to 101 song titles. In the top of the list you may find, "In The Mood", "Sentimental Journey", "Boogie Woogie Bugle Boy", "Lili Marleen", and "It's Been A Long, Long Time". In those years, the albums featured the name of the big bands with a mention of the vocal artist such as Kitty Kallen, Bing Crosby, and Frank Sinatra in smaller fonts. The song, "It's Been A Long, Long Time" was written by Jule Styne (music) and Sammy Cahn (lyrics). The version that made it to number one on the charts was recorded by the Harry James Orchestra with Kitty Kallen as the featured vocalist. The lyrics are written from the viewpoint of one who is welcoming home a loved one who has been away at war. Another memorable version of the song was recorded at the time by Bing Crosby with the Les Paul Trio. There are versions of the song recorded well into the 1960's. "Well I told you all of that to tell you this" as Ron Tomason of Dry Branch Fire Squad often declares. There is an individual in Philadelphia, George Blood, who is working a project to digitize 78 rpm recordings and cylinder recordings. His sources are musical archives of these media found in the likes of the Library of Congress and the Philadelphia Orchestra.
