Carrie Elkin and Danny Schmidt



Somewhere along the winding and tangled paths of their touring lives, Carrie and Danny became entwined romantically and then artistically and began touring together in 2012. If the chemistry seems especially magical, they come by it honestly, as they are a rare breed: a romantic partnership in real life, not just musical life. And the two together on stage makes for a classic case of the whole being greater than the sum of its parts.

Named to the Chicago Tribune's 50 Most Significant Songwriters in the Last 50 Years, Austin, TX-based singer/songwriter Danny Schmidt has been rapidly ascending from underground cult hero to being widely recognized as an artist of generational significance. With lyrical depth drawing comparisons to Leonard Cohen, Townes Van Zandt, and Dave Carter, Danny is considered a preeminent writer, an artist whose earthy poetry manages to somehow conjure magic from the mundane, leading Sing Out Magazine to tag him "Perhaps the best new songwriter we've heard in the last 15 years."

Carrie Elkin is a soulful singer with a gypsy spirit, a songwriter with a keen eye. Inspired by her travels and the many places she has called home-- Ohio, New Mexico, Colorado, Boston, Austin--she documents the human condition with sensitivity and humor, crafting songs that have garnered attention at prestigious songwriting contests, including Mountain Stage NewSong and the Falcon Ridge Emerging Artist Showcase.

Their debut duo CD, ***For Keeps***, has been extremely well received This is a chance to hear another of Austin's great singer-songwriter duos at Second Saturday. Please come join us.

Second Saturday Concert is presented by the **Houston Folklore and Music Society**, a nonprofit organization dedicated to the preservation of folklore and acoustic music. Coming from the north (Houston), take 288 South towards Pearland. We are three exits past Beltway 8. Exit to the right on CR59 (County Road 59 aka Southfork). At the light for CR59, take a LEFT and go under the freeway. Proceed through the next stop light at CR 94 (Smith Ranch Road). The first place you can turn LEFT after the CR94 light is CRESTWOOD Drive at the entrance to Crestwood Cove subdivision. (It's at this point you begin to sing "Little Boxes....") Make a RIGHT at the first stop sign, turning onto Capecrest Drive. At the next stop sign take a LEFT onto Covebrook DRIVE. Just ahead on the LEFT is the cul de sac COVEBROOK COURT. Make a left into the cul de sac and our home is 2802.

In honor of St. Paddy's day this month, we offer this well-known Irish ballad. Despite the Scots-sounding "bonnie wee lassie", this song is definitely Irish in origin. Carnlough Bay is in Northern Ireland, and is, in fact, the location of Pat Hamill's Hotel (though it is now called the Glencloy Inn). Pat Hamill's was a center for cycling enthusiasts, where folks could stop off on their excursions, and a brisk business in renting bicycles was carried on there. St. Patrick's Day trivia — “Wearing of the green”

On St Patrick's Day it is customary to wear shamrocks and/or green clothing or accessories (the "wearing of the green"). In pagan Ireland, three was a significant number and the Irish had many triple deities, a fact that may have aided St Patrick in his evangelization efforts.

STACKS OF WAX

In 1887 Edison formed the Edison Phonograph Company to sell recordings of music on wax cylinders. By 1909, disc recordings came into use. These disc were made from a type of shellac, and by 1946, pressed vinyl recordings were introduced. However, radio DJ's of the 1950's still referred to these recordings as "stacks of wax". Most of you are familiar with the cassette tapes, 8 track recordings, CD's and the progress to digital music files. It was thought the

pressed vinyl LP was left to history. Yet, that is not the case. LP sales were on a steady decline until 2005. Now they are in a resurgence. Since 2008, LP sales have increased 225%. This translates to annual sales of \$422 million. This figure is still smaller than that which is paid to streaming services and suppliers of digital music. At the peak of the LP sales in 1978, sales amounted to \$2.78 billion.

Who are buying these? It turns out the majority are males under 25. There is a wave of nostalgia regarding the LP album. One gets to read the liner notes, and experiences more of a connection with the music as the album is placed on the turntable. To skip a track, one has to intercede with the turntable operation and lift the arm to the next track. It is opined that the LP and turntable outputs a warmer and fuller sound compared to the digital formatted recordings which are a compressed digital image that trims the low and high frequencies. Though some say this phenomenon has peaked, in Austria, there is a company in the process of developing a HD LP recording process. An HD turntable would be necessary to fully appreciate these, but they would be backward compatible with the traditional turntables. Whatever the future holds for the pressed vinyl recording, at present one can go on to Amazon and other online suppliers and find re-mastered vinyl recordings of yesteryears favorites as well as vinyl LP recordings of the current Grammy winners.
