

Continue 4.5 miles on TX-105 through beautiful downtown *Cut And Shoot*. Just past Caney Creek, turn left onto FM-1484. Continue 3.5 miles on FM-1484. THE LONELIEST BOY IN THE TOWN

Michael Troy's music may be one of the lesser-known treasures of 21st century American acoustic music. His sad ballads of life in his home town of Fall River, Massachusetts earned him the sobriquet of "The Poet Laureate of Fall River". Michael played for us at Second Saturday in 2007 and 2011, and was a Kerrville New Folk winner in 2010. We lost Michael to cancer on November 29, 2015. This deeply evocative Christmas song from his CD *Mill Town Boy* is representative of Michael's best work. Nothing so tender as the love of a father As sure and steady as hourglass sand. The fatherless boy, the husbandless mother The poet, the prophet, the savior of man.

Snow flows in circles, Revealing the wind And Christmas lights glow in a halo.

I've known Ed Miller for years. Brian McNeill once called him "For many, the voice of Scotland in America." Ed's CD "Come Awa' Wi' Me," is a testament to this title.

Ed opens with "Walk The Road," a Kate Rusby composition, which seems to me to invite the listener to a journey to walk the road of life together. There are two older compositions, Ralph McTell's "Streets of London," and Ewan McColl's "Thirty Foot Trailer."

The lovely, but sad, traditional tune "Bonnie Bessie Logan" is a doleful lament of an elder lover who cannot love her because she was "ower (over) young for me."

Ed does several songs in Scottish dialect, but translates some of the words in parentheses in the lyric pamphlet. such as in the case of the rousing 'The Merchant's Son," among other traditional tunes.

The labor classic "The Wark (work) of The Weavers" is a tribute to the weaving trade which asks the musical question,"If it wasna' (wasn't) for the weavers, what would we do?"

The last song is "Gonna Get Through This World," a Woody Guthrie poem set to music by Lisa Gurkin. Ed does an excellent rendition of Woody's indomitable spirit.

If you want a tutorial on Scottish dialect, as well as some great musicianship, I highly recommend this CD. It proves that Ed Miller is, indeed, for many "The voice of Scotland in America."

History of a Carol: Silent Night

"Silent Night" (German: *Stille Nacht, heilige Nacht*) is a popular Christmas carol, composed in 1818 by Franz Xaver Gruber to lyrics by Joseph Mohr in the small town of Oberndorf bei Salzburg, Austria. It was declared an intangible cultural heritage by UNESCO in 2011. The song has been recorded by a large number of singers from every music genre. The version sung by Bing Crosby is the third best-selling single of all-time.

The song was first performed on Christmas Eve 1818 at St Nicholas parish church in Oberndorf, a village in the Austrian Empire on the Salzach river in present-day Austria. A young priest, Father Joseph Mohr, had come to Oberndorf the year before. He had written the lyrics of the song "Stille Nacht" in 1816 at Mariapfarr, the hometown of his father in the Salzburg Lungau region, where Joseph had worked as a co-adjutor.

The melody was composed by Franz Xaver Gruber, schoolmaster and organist in the nearby village of Arnsdorf. Before Christmas Eve, Mohr brought the words to Gruber and asked him to compose a melody and guitar accompaniment for the Christmas Eve mass.^[2] (Legend suggests that the reason for composing on guitar was that the organ was broken, but Gruber's written account does not mention this.) Together they performed the new carol during the mass on the night of 24 December.
