It's been a while since we had a singaround with multiple singer-songwriters. At our May concert we are definitely going to fix that by bringing you Houston's own Ken Gaines with Wayne Wilkerson, and Austin's Karen Mal and Will Taylor.

Ken Gaines has been well known to Houston audiences for many years, hosting the Thursday night songwriter's series at Anderson Fair and amazing us with the breadth of his skill and imagination with his many, many award-winning songs in a variety of styles. **Wayne Wilkerson** is a virtuoso lead guitarist whom Sonicbids has dubbed "Houston's most called-upon guitar accompanist" Wayne also performs lead guitar and vocals with the **Swingfield Playboys**.

Based in Austin, TX, **Karen Mal** has created a name for herself as a captivating singer, instrumentalist and songwriter. Ranging from charming to seductive, impressionistic to philosophical, her songs have brought her nationwide acclaim. She has won top awards from the Wildflower Arts and Music Festival in Texas, the Tucson Folk Festival and the Portland Songwriters Association and has also been a three time New Folk Finalist at Kerrville, emerging artist at Falcon Ridge and a finalist at the Sisters Folk Festival.

Will Taylor is perhaps best known for his lead role with **Strings Attached**, who have backed up many top artists, including Grammy-winners Pearl Jam, Shawn Colvin, Eliza Gilkyson, and Bob Schneider. One of the world's only jazz viola players, the *Houston Post* called Will: "a jazz violist and composer who absolutely transcends his instrument's stereotypical European refinement and restraint. His work is dynamic, colorful and, yes, even edgy."

When we get this many great musicians on stage together, memorable things happen. And they are very good memories. Come out and join us May 13.

Second Saturday Concert is presented by the **Houston Folklore and Music Society**, a nonprofit organization dedicated to the preservation of folklore and acoustic music. Refreshments are available. TEN GUINEAS IN GOLD I WILL SLIP IN YOUR FIST

We could consider this a 19th century anti-war song. It was first collected around 1840 in Limerick by Patrick Weston Joyce. Many traditional songs tell of aggressive recruitment tactics and paying the king's gold or getting young men drunk to get them to enlist. I haven't previously seen one where the would-be "recruits" take matters into their own hands quite as forcefully as Arthur McBride and his cousin. I was aware that Guthrie often took melodies from other songs to go with his lyrics. His *Union Maid* is sung to the folk melody of *Red Wing.* And it turns out his most popular song, *This Land Is Your Land*, has been put to the melody of The Carter Family's *When The World Was On Fire.* I thought it fitting to give credit to the Carter Family by posting this link to a version of their tune as done very well by the Carolina Chocolate Drops. *When The World Was on Fire*.

HAPPY MAY DAY!



RESONATOR GUITAR TRIVIA



In 1927, John Dopyera and John Beauchamp developed the resonator guitar to increase the volume of a guitar which at the time was overwhelmed by the volume of the brass and reed instruments of the then popular dance bands. These guitars with their resonating aluminum cones (these were tricone models) were marketed under the

National name. In the following year John Dopyera left National and formed the Dobro Manufacturing Company with his four brothers. Their design was that of a single resonator cone with a spider bridge with a distinctive circular perforated cover. This design was perceived to produce more volume than the National tricone models. While the name "Dobro" is often and rightly understood to be a contraction for Dopyera Brothers, the brothers chose this as the name of their company because in their native Slovak language *dobrota* means goodness.

TWO SONGS OF THE CIVIL WAR

In thinking of the songs of the American Civil War, "Dixie Land", aka "Dixie" comes to mind very quickly. It was a song written by an Ohio-born composer, Daniel Emmett. The Snowden Family, an African-American musical group of the 19th century, is claimed to have collaborated on its composition. The song was sung in minstrel shows and became popular across the country in the 1850's. During the civil war, it was virtually adopted as an anthem for the south. The name "Dixie" became the name for the union of the southern states. As popular as the song once was, it is now considered offensive. Thanks to a comment made by Eric Johnson, I became aware of another song which was sung by both sides of the conflict. That song is "Lorena". The lyrics were written by Rev. Henry Webster after a broken engagement with his fiancée, Ella Blocksom. Rev. Webster changed her name in the poem to Lenore. It

was Joseph Philbrick Webster, a friend not a relative, who wrote the music. J.P. Webster was also the musical composer for "Twine Mid the Ringlets", better known to us as "Wildwood Flower". When Miss Blocksom broke off the engagement with Rev. Webster, she did so by a letter which included the words "If we try, we may forget". He included those words in the lyrics. J. P. Webster felt he needed a three syllable name to fit better with his melody, so Rev. Webster obliged him by changing the name to Lorena. "Lorene" or "Lorena", the lyrics and melody evoked feelings for the soldiers 'wives and girl friends who were waiting for them back in their home towns. Thus Lorena was heard often where soldiers on either side were gathered.


