

Albert and Gage



Christine Albert and her husband and musical partner, **Chris Gage**, are a perfect example of why Austin, Texas, has such a thriving music community, not just a "scene." In addition to various musical collaborations, they've lent their talents to countless benefits (for organizations like Meals On Wheels, United Way, and the Austin Children's Museum, and often to help fellow musicians out of a bind), and Christine's speaking engagements have included everything from the Family Violence Task Force to the Rotary Club.

Christine Albert and Chris Gage have a personal and musical chemistry that can't be denied or ignored. Their energy on stage is infectious. Together they travel through their musical roots moving from country, rock, swing and folk to blues and French chansons. Their rare blend of voices creates a unique sound, whether they are performing originals, songs written by close friends or well chosen covers. Chris Gage is a master of the guitar, piano and accordion, effortlessly switching instruments throughout their set to follow the mood of the music.

On any given evening, a concert by Albert and Gage might take you from the dusty backwoods of Texas to a bistro along the Seine, from a Louisiana jive joint to a high plains gospel sing. The pair moves easily and without a break from their own original music to Ray Charles, Gram Parsons, Edith Piaf, George Jones, Dan Hicks, Bob Dylan, Johnny Cash, Daniel Lanois, and back again. "It is spontaneous, "Gage said. "I can start a certain song on the piano and she'll know the next two or three songs, or I can see where she's putting the capo on her guitar and I'll know what song she's thinking about."

Second Saturday Concert is presented by the **Houston Folklore and Music Society**, a nonprofit organization dedicated to the preservation of folklore and acoustic music. Refreshments are available for purchase. Tickets are sold at the door - adults \$15, senior citizens (65) and students with ID \$11, and children under 12 free with adults. Concerts are held the second Saturdays of each month in the <u>West University Community Center</u> at 6104 Auden (intersection of Auden. and Rice Blvd.). Coming from the north (Houston), take 288 South towards Pearland. We are three exits past Beltway 8. Exit to the right on CR59 (County Road 59 aka Southfork). At the light for CR59, take a LEFT and go under the freeway. Proceed through the next stop light at CR 94 (Smith Ranch Road). The first place you can turn LEFT after the CR94 light is CRESTWOOD Drive at the entrance to Crestwood Cove subdivision. (It's at this point you begin to sing "Little Boxes....") Make a RIGHT at the first stop sign, turning onto Capecrest Drive. At the next stop sign take a LEFT onto Covebrook DRIVE. Just ahead on the LEFT is the cul de sac COVEBROOK COURT. Make a left into the cul de sac and our home is 2802.

Feel free to park in the driveway. Be careful parking on the street as it's difficult for folks to get out of their driveways when cars are parked too close to the driveway. You can park on Covebrook DRIVE if needed.



IN CELEBRATION OF THE JANUARY 25 BIRTHDAY OF ROBERT BURNS

Robert Burns (25 January 1759 – 21 July 1796), also known as **Rabbie Burns**, the **Bard of Ayrshire**, **Ploughman Poet** and various other names and epithets,^[nb 1] was a Scottish poet and lyricist. He is widely regarded as the national poet of Scotland and is celebrated worldwide. He is the best known of the poets who have written in the Scots language, although much of his writing is also in English and a light Scots dialect, accessible to an audience beyond Scotland. He also wrote in standard English, and in these writings his political or civil commentary is often at its bluntest. He is regarded as a pioneer of the Romantic movement, and after his death he became a great source of inspiration to the founders of both liberalism and

socialism, and a cultural icon in Scotland and among the Scottish diaspora around the world. Celebration of his life and work became almost a national charismatic cult during the 19th and 20th centuries, and his influence has long been strong on Scottish literature. In 2009 he was chosen as the greatest Scot by the Scottish public in a vote run by Scottish television channel STV.

As well as making original compositions, Burns also collected folk songs from across Scotland, often revising or adapting them. His poem (and song) "Auld Lang Syne" is often sung at Hogmanay (the last day of the year), and "Scots Wha Hae" served for a long time as an unofficial national anthem of the country. Other poems and songs of Burns that remain well known across the world today include "A Red, Red Rose", "A Man's a Man for A' That", "To a Louse", "To a Mouse", "The Battle of Sherramuir", "Tam o' Shanter" and "Ae Fond Kiss".

POSTSCRIPT TO THE BLUES

I have recently completed a three part article for the CPR on the blues. That done, this is a postscript provided by the Rolling Stones release a new album "Blue and Lonesome" which is a collection of covers written by American blues artist. There is an excellent review of this in the Rolling Stone magazine: <u>Review of "Blue and Lonesome"</u> With little need to expand on this, I would like to bring to light two comments from the review. One is that "when the Rolling Stones first heard the American blues it was to them in a foreign language of the lust and trials of older, hardened men". Now, the Stones can perform these songs so well in the vernacular of the blues. The other comment was that the band recorded these songs in three days. The title cut, Little Walter's "Blue and Lonesome", was recorded in one take. It is as though they have been preparing for this their entire career.

Trivia thanks to "acousticmusic.org": In 1011 BCE the future King Solomon was born. In approximately 985 BCE Solomon penned the lyrics to the 1965 AD number 1 hit: <u>Turn! Turn! Turn!</u> as covered by the Byrds. The words were recorded in Ecclesiastes 3:1. The music was later provided by Pete Seeger in 1959 AD. This makes King Solomon the earliest known author (with writer's credit) of a Billboard 100 charted hit.
