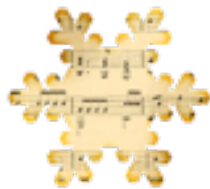

From Ithaca, N.Y., Joe Crookston received a grant from the Rockefeller Foundation to travel, collect stories, and write songs based on his experiences. Pretty good work if you can get it! He was voted "Most Wanted Artist" at the Falcon Ridge Folk Festival,

played main stage at Kerrville, and his CD, "Able Baker Charlie and Dog" was awarded "Album of the Year" by the International Folk Alliance in Memphis, TN. Joe stands on stage thumping out the rhythm, stomping his foot, singing story songs about drunk roosters, ex-slaves, dangling window washers, Tinian Island and the cycles of life. His new CD, "Joe Crookston 2017" has been very enthusiastically received.

When we first heard Joe in the New Folk Competition at Kerrville in 2010, he was clearly the best of the bunch. We bought his CD and played it all the way home from Kerrville. Joe has played at Second Saturday in 2011 and 2013, and has wowed us both times.

Joe's songs engage our minds and our emotions. His songs about people and their stories bring together the elements of narrative, melody, harmony and rhythm in a way that excite all the senses. If we could look at a scan of somebody's brain listening to Joe Crookston, it would be lit up in a lot of places, I think. Don't miss this chance to hear Ithaca's finest!

Second Saturday Concert is presented by the **Houston Folklore and Music Society**, a nonprofit organization dedicated to the preservation of folklore and acoustic music. Homemade refreshments are available. Tickets are sold at the door - adults \$15, senior citizens (65) \$11, and children under 12 free with adults. 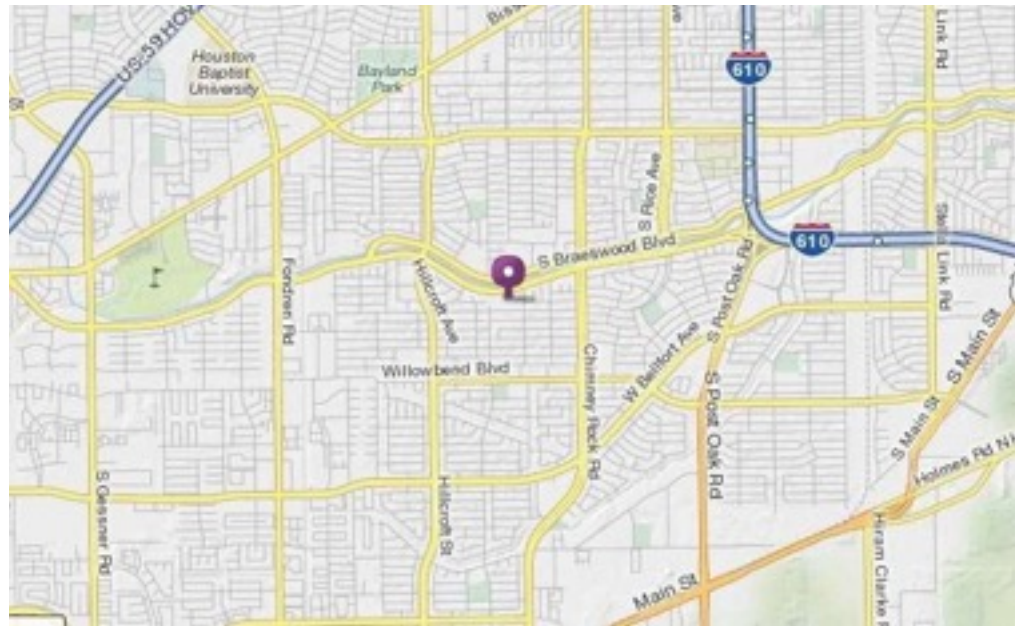

 - after 3.6 miles
- Keep right to stay on Farm to Market 1093 W
 - after 1.0 mile

WE TOOK CARE OF THE BOYS

The Folk Alliance International invited Joe Crookston, our February 10 Second Saturday artist (see Page 1) to be the Artist in Residence at the 2016 Conference in Kansas City MO. Joe collaborated with the National World War I Museum in Kansas City, digging into their archives of letters, photographs, field recordings and objects from WWI. After reading hundreds of letters, Joe chose to tell the story of Florence Hemphill, a woman. A nurse of Scottish ancestry from Wilson County Kansas. A worker less honored in the history books. Florence was a courageous medical presence in France during some of the most intense fighting. "Telling Stories, Writing Songs: An Album Of Texas Songwriters" Review

Several years ago, I bought a book which I mistakingly thought was about the crafts of storytelling and songwriting. I kept this book for a long time without really knowing what it contained. It turns out that it's an anthology of Texas singer-songwriter interviews by Kathleen Hudson, of whom I know virtually nothing. The introduction is by B. B. King, and the forward is by Sun Records guru, Sam Phillips.

The book contains a treasure trove of the most prominent Texas artists: Guy Clark, Willie Nelson, Townes Van Zandt, Floyd Tillman, Joe Ely, Lyle Lovett, Steve Earle, Robert Earl Keen, Tish Hinojosa, Kinky Friedman (what in the heck is he talking about?), and Marcia Ball, just to name a few. However, there is no mention of Nanci Griffith, Steve Fromholz, or Eric Taylor. I found that a bit puzzling, but enjoyed reading the book, anyway.

Each artist--with the exception of Friedman--presents a deep, personal perspective on the craft of songwriting, and how they were inspired to write. Sonny Throckmorton asserted, "Writing is like living. They're one and the same." Townes Van Zandt revealed, "You've ruined your whole life, and you get all the way up, and then you hit that one note, and everything is okay." Robert Earl Keen convincingly shared "If I'm not entertaining others, I can entertain myself by writing a song. I derive enjoyment and satisfaction from that." Guy Clark noted, "It's the performance. It's just as much of the writing process as the rest of it." Willie Nelson humbly added, "I didn't really change anything ...so much as to join an already growing movement, a legion of people who like good music ... who like to listen to and play whatever they want to."

This excellent book is available on Amazon and Kindle, among other distributors. If you like the Texas singer-songwriter genre, I highly recommend this educational book.

WILL THE CIRCLE BE UNBROKEN

In 1972, the Nitty Gritty Dirt Band recorded an album, "Will The Circle Be Unbroken". It is a two disc set in which the band members desired to tie two generations of musicians together. There were many well known names from the senior generation, such as Doc Watson, Merle Travis, Randy Scruggs and June Carter Cash, just to name a few. Most of the talent was well known on the *Grand*

Ole Opry stage. In 2002, they released "Will The Circle Be Unbroken III", another double disc, in an effort to fill out the circle. So, this is one way to construct a circle of musical traditions.

There was another circle of musical traditions completed. This circle came about by the talented Alan Wilson. He was born in a Boston suburb of Arlington, MA. In his teen years, he proved to be musically talented and spent time with a jazz ensemble. He went on to Boston University to study music, and at this time, he played the coffeehouses. It was during this period that Wilson became a devotee of the blues masters of the 1930's and 40's. Wilson and Bob Hite formed the band, "Canned Heat" in 1965. The band had a bluesy sound and featured Alan's high tenor voice which was inspired by bluesmen such as Skip James and Tommy Johnson.

It was during the year 1964, when the circle was completed as the blues masters of the 30's and 40's were being rediscovered, and these individuals were being sought out for recording their work anew. When Edward James "Son" House was first contacted he was working as a railroad porter, having long retired from making music. This issue was overcome. Alan Wilson worked with Son House for several months helping him to relearn his songs and his guitar techniques, which Wilson had mastered while studying House's recordings of the 30's and 40's. You can hear Son House and Alan Wilson play together on a recording of [Levee Camp Roan](#). Wilson is playing the harmonica.

Their Lives Were All Too Brief

Alan "Blind Owl" Wilson was an extremely talented musician who accomplished much by the age of 22. He cofounded with Bob Hite, the rock and blues band, *Canned Heat* in 1965. He was given the nickname of "Blind Owl" because of his extreme near-

sightedness. He once put his guitar down on a cake, because he did not see the cake. At times, he could not recognize his band-mates without his glasses. Sadly, he was found dead behind the home of Bob Hite having succumbed from acute barbiturate intoxication. Within a 31 day period, Jimi Hendrix and Janis Joplin would perish from overdoses. Each were in the 27th year of their lives. Sadly this has happened to many well known musicians. Robert Johnson, the blues master, died in 1938 at the same age. There is an article that ran in the New York Daily News which chronicled many such celebrity deaths at this age. It was called the "27 Club" and includes other musicians such as Graham Parsons, Kurt Cobain, Jim Morrison, and Amy Winehouse.

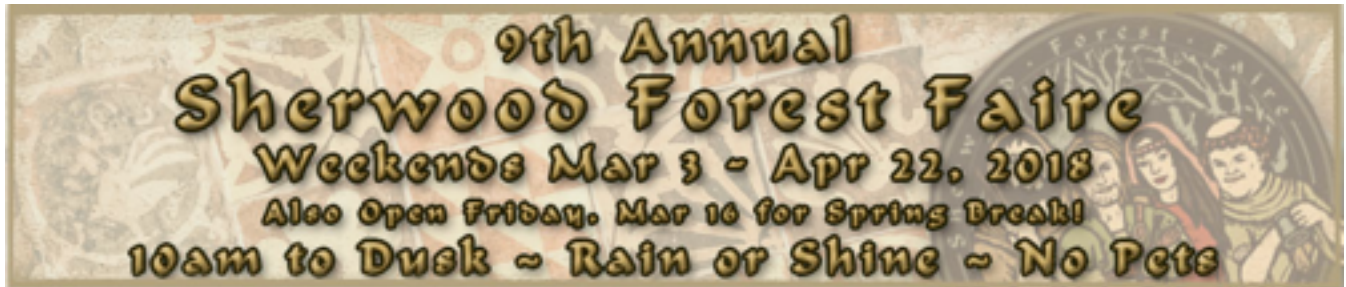

Status Report from the Board of Directors

Here is a new feature for the Cotton Patch Rag- -some information from your Board of Directors about what's going on in the realm of society management and operations. The board met on January 25. Some news from that meeting follows.

Your board has seven members, who are elected to 3-year terms. Two of those positions expired at the end of 2017. The incumbents in those positions, Andy Longo and Neely Atkinson, were nominated for another term. Their official elections will take place at the February First Monday meeting.

Your officers (President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer) serve 1-year terms. Therefore, all the officer positions were open at the end of 2017. At the meeting all the incumbents agreed to serve another term, and the board re-elected them. The current officers for 2018 are thus Carl Brainerd (President), Gayle Fallon (Vice President), Neely Atkinson (Secretary), and Paul Cooper (Treasurer).

The other news from the meeting concerns our Second Saturday Concert series. We have always had the goal of getting good talent for the concerts (naturally!), and also to give them a decent paycheck, given that they have travel expenses to come here and entertain us. We have also had our ticket prices set as low as we thought we could, resulting in Second Saturday historically being a comparative bargain in the Houston concert market. We have lately found ourselves in the position of losing money on the Second Saturday concerts. This was due in part to low attendance at some of the concerts, in addition to what we felt the musicians should be paid. Also, did you know that using the Community Center is not free? It costs us \$270 each month to rent the hall, so that is a significant fraction of the gate receipts. Of course, this situation cannot continue indefinitely. The bottom line is that the board reluctantly concluded that we needed to have an increase in the ticket prices for Second Saturday, effective next September, in order to continue to maintain a good financial posture. The new pricing will be \$18 (adults) and \$14 (seniors). We hope that our loyal audience will continue to recognize the Second Saturday concerts as a unique and quality event, showcasing great talent, and still competitive in the Houston concert market.

We are making plans for a new Facebook page, and perhaps some other social media activity (to be announced).
