## Amanda Pascali and The Family The Houston Balalaika Society Orchestra





#### Second Saturday is going international big-time for our May show!

Renaissance woman and singer/songwriter, Amanda Pascali was born in Queens, New York and is based in Houston. Amanda's 'Immigrant American Folk Music' showcases her traditional influences, but she is no copy of anyone. As the daughter of an Eastern European refugee, Amanda writes with a sincerity which shows us that home is truly where the heart is. Accompanied by accordion player Felix Lyons and violinist Addison Freeman, she has released music and performed internationally, carrying with her the revolutionary passion and poetry of a young girl growing up in the United States. Her style is recognizably that of the American singer-songwriter, but sprinkled bountifully with European flavors. She is also a premier vocalist with the Houston Balalaika Society Orchestra.

The Houston Balalaika Society Orchestra was founded in 1976. Currently under the direction of Pam Bingham, they perform throughout the Houston area an impressive repertoire of folk and semi-classical music from Russia and Eastern Europe, as well as the occasional popular or secular tune. The fire & grace of this unique music is always impressive, and leaves many audiences wondering how they missed being a fan of this incredible music for so long. This will be an extraordinary musical evening. Be sure to put this one on your calendars and join us Saturday, May 12!

Second Saturday Concert is presented by the Houston Folklore and Music Society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to the preservation of folklore and acoustic music. DIRECTIONS TO 4014 Essex Lane.

Terry's home is near Central Market, Highland Village Apple Store & Williams Sonoma. It is literally half way between the Westheimer/Weslayan and Alabama/Weslayan intersections (and 1 1/2 blocks to the west) for reference purposes.

Access from the West Loop: take Westheimer exit, head east (toward town), cross the RR tracks and turn right either on Suffolk (which is easy to miss) or Drexel (stoplight/ Apple Store is a good landmark). Proceed down Drexel to 2<sup>nd</sup> street, turn right on Essex Ln. Or, if on Suffolk, turn left on Essex Ln.

Access from I59/I69 (Southwest Frwy): take Weslayan exit, head north (toward Edwards Theater). Can turn left at either the Alabama light or take the 2<sup>nd</sup> median break past Alabama (Essex Ln). If on Alabama, go to stop sign, turn right on Drexel,

and turn left on 2<sup>nd</sup> street (Essex Ln). If on Essex Ln, proceed to stop sign, then go straight 1/2 block more.

#### WHE STOLE THE CUDDY?

This one is a shout-out to my wonderful friends from the North of England. Geordie Ridley was not the original Geordie, but a much revered one among these folks who love their music and their musicians. Blaydon is about 4 miles from Newcastle. And yes, interurban bus service (horse-drawn) did exist in England in 1862. Some of the events in the song are real, it seems. Coffy Johnny was an actual historical figure. Ridley sang this song at Balmbra's Music Hall on June 5, 1862. "Blaydon Races" has become an anthem for **Newcastle United**, and they sing it at all the games. Indeed,

some call this song the unofficial Geordie anthem. This goes out to Helen, Steve, Chris, Michael and John – though Helen is the one actually from the town where they hung the monkey. Ah me lads, ye shudda seen us gannin',

We pass'd the foaks alang the road just as they wor stannin'; Thor wis lots o' lads an' lassies there, aal wi' smiling faces, Gannin' alang the Scotswood Road, to see the Blaydon Races.

We flew across the Chain Bridge reet into Blaydon toon, The bellman he was callin' there, they call him Jackie Broon; Aa saw him talkin' to sum cheps, an' them he was pursuadin' To gan an' see Geordy Ridley's concert in the Mechanics' Hall at Blaydon.

The rain it poor'd aall the day an' mayed the groons quite muddy, Coffy Johnny had a white hat on – they war shootin' "Whe stole the cuddy." There wis spice stalls an' munkey shows an' aud wives selling ciders, An' a chep wiv a hapenny roond aboot, shootin' "Noo, me lads, for riders."

John Prine's The Tree of Forgiveness

As John Prine comes of age, his lyrical talent seems to grow and grow. This is demonstrated on his latest project, "The Tree of Forgiveness," a compilation of co-written and solo efforts.

Most of the songs are co-written with such songwriters as Keith Sykes, Pat McIsughlin, and Phil Spector, just to name a few.

"Knockin' On Your Screen Door" tells of a somewhat forgotten man who doesn't seem to mind his semi-anonymous life, because, for example, "Under the dashboard/got some sweet potato wine," He "can see your back porch/lf I close my eyes now..." On "I Have Met My Love Today," "It doesn't really matter/What we had to say/I have met my love today."

One of my favorite selections is "The Lonesome Friends Of Science, on which I sense a hint of Townes Van Zandt lyricism: The friends say that "the world will end in any day/ Well, if it does, then that's OK/'Cause I don't live here, anyway...'

My other favorite, "When I Get To Heaven," He says when he gets there he's "...gonna get a cocktail Vodka and Ginger Ale,...I'm gonna smoke a cigarette that's nine miles long...this old man is going to town..."

These are just a few masterpieces contained on this great CD. It is a great view of Prine's jaded, but often humorous philosophy. Buy it and see if you don't agree.
