Albert and Gage



Christine Albert and her husband and musical partner, **Chris Gage**, are a perfect example of why Austin, Texas, has such a thriving music community, not just a “scene.” In addition to various musical collaborations, they’ve lent their talents to countless benefits (for organizations like Meals On Wheels, United Way, and the Austin Children’s Museum, and often to help fellow musicians out of a bind), and Christine’s speaking engagements have included everything from the Family Violence Task Force to the Rotary Club.

Christine Albert and Chris Gage have a personal and musical chemistry that can't be denied or ignored. Their energy on stage is infectious. Together they travel through their musical roots moving from country, rock, swing and folk to blues and French chansons. Their rare blend of voices creates a unique sound, whether they are performing originals, songs written by close friends or well chosen covers. Chris Gage is a master of the guitar, piano and accordion, effortlessly switching instruments throughout their set to follow the mood of the music.

On any given evening, a concert by Albert and Gage might take you from the dusty backwoods of Texas to a bistro along the Seine, from a Louisiana jive joint to a high plains gospel sing. The pair moves easily and without a break from their own original music to Ray Charles, Gram Parsons, Edith Piaf, George Jones, Dan Hicks, Bob Dylan, Johnny Cash, Daniel Lanois, and back again. "It is spontaneous," Gage said. "I can start a certain song on the piano and she'll know the next two or three songs, or I can see where she's putting the capo on her guitar and I'll know what song she's thinking about."

Second Saturday Concert is presented by the **Houston Folklore and Music Society**, a nonprofit organization dedicated to the preservation of folklore and acoustic music. Refreshments are available at the food table. Tickets are sold at the door - adults \$18, senior citizens (65) \$14, and children under 12 free with adults.

NOTE: The January concert will be held at Covenant Church, 4949 Caroline, Houston, Texas. Betty called the dances, and the program included a broom dance which, if you’ve never experienced one, was quite fun to watch and play for. About 200 people braved the cold to participate in the good times.

McCUTCHEON WOWS FRIENDS OF FOLKLORE

In an unprecedented free concert at the West University Community building November 30, singer-songwriter and traditional music wizard **John McCutcheon** gave a virtuoso concert in honor of **Bob and Gay Pangle** and their long service to the Houston Folklore and Music Society (HFMS), the Second Saturday Concert series, and countless other concerts and festivals extending over several decades. Thanks to the generosity of an anonymous donor, HFMS was able to open the concert doors to all its membership as well as to presenters, house concert hosts, volunteers, media, musicians and other supporters of folk and acoustic music.

Carolyn Davis emceed the event with her characteristic charm and aplomb. **Bob and Sue Lahmeyer** set up and ran the sound as McCutcheon worked his magic on multiple instruments from a variety of points on the stage – a challenging enterprise for any sound engineer. As usual, the sound was excellent. Thanks to an expert crew of HFMS board members and volunteers, chairs for the capacity (over 130) crowd appeared as needed, and the refreshment table was a sellout success.

John McCutcheon performed like the world-class showman he is on banjo, fiddle, guitar, autoharp, keyboard and hammer dulcimer. He regaled the audience with some wonderful reminiscences of his mentor Pete Seeger, and even reminded us a little of Pete as he moved his lanky body around the stage. Musical highlights included his original song, ***Christmas in the Trenches*** and an inspiring rendition of **Woody Guthrie’s *Pastures of Plenty*** on hammer dulcimer.

It was a wonderful night as we paid tribute to the Pangles, to folk music greats living and dead, and were able to treat Houston’s music community to a great show. Thanks to all who attended and especially to those who helped us put it on.

While I am not overly familiar with the work of Ray Wylie Hubbard--hard to believe, huh? LOL!--I have enjoyed "Redneck Mother," "Muddy Boggy Banjo Man, and, lately, thanks to Leslie Krafka, "Drunken Poet's Dream." Thanks to his autobiography "a life... well, lived." I have been thoroughly educated and enlightened.

Hubbard tells his story in two literary styles--stream-of-consciousness reflections, and the regular prose format. It also contains the lyrics to some of his songs, as well as background material on how they came to be written. I find "Redneck Mother" the most fascinating example.

The book is also a history of his associations with such performers as Willie Nelson, Jerry Jeff Walker, Rusty Wier, Bob Livingston, John Inmon, John Vandiver, B. W. Stevenson, and Townes Van Zandt.

After reading this book, I came away with the realization that Hubbard is a performer who has overcome a lot of obstacles, and has really paid his dues. He has truly experienced "a life... well lived." I recommend it highly. See if you don't agree with my recommendation.

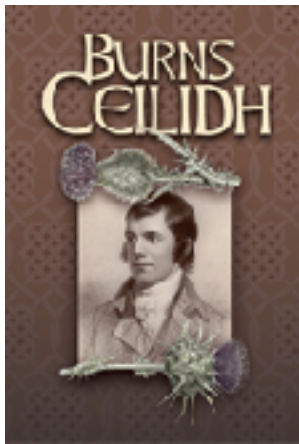
