Steve Fisher



Songwriter **John Fullbright** says: "My dear friend **Steve Fisher**... one of the greatest songwriters that ever put pen to paper and I feel like more folks need to know that." Fullbright goes on to caution concert goers that "Steve is one of those twist-the-knife-it's-so beautiful songwriters, so maybe bring a tissue." Songwriter **Buddy Mondlock** recently explained who Steve is, saying "Steve Fisher is the guy you wander around the Kerrville Folk Festival campground at 4AM looking for so you can hear that amazing baritone voice."

Songwriter **Steve Fisher** says: I've been writing songs I'd call "keepers" since '86, and playing professionally a few years longer than that. I was a finalist in the Kerrville New Folk songwriting contest in '89 and a winner in '90. I also won the Sugarbush Folk Festival songwriting competition (in Sugarbush, Vermont) in '89 during my first tour along the East Coast. I toured for a few years from coast to coast until I found I was at odds with all the road asked of me. Planning my life in advance, meaning booking my time months or even a year in advance seemed not in keeping with my foremost desire to live in the present moment. I also never wanted to put the pressure of my day to day existence on my art, specifically songwriting. Because of this decision to basically only play gigs where I was asked to come play, two things happened. First, I learned a lot of different skills, from rock work to general construction, painting, etc... (you get the picture) to get by. And most importantly, I found an abundance of time to write. And looking back I wouldn't change how I came to find the songs I've written over the years.

Second Saturday Concert is presented by the **Houston Folklore/Music Society**, a nonprofit organization dedicated to the preservation of folklore and folk/acoustic music. Coffee, water, cookies and sandwiches are available. Tickets are sold at the door - adults \$18, senior citizens (65) \$14, and children under 12 free with adults. Concerts are held the second Saturdays of each month in the West University Community Building at 6104 Auden (intersection of Auden. and Rice Blvd.) Phone Paul Cooper at 713-204-1207 (cell) for more concert information. 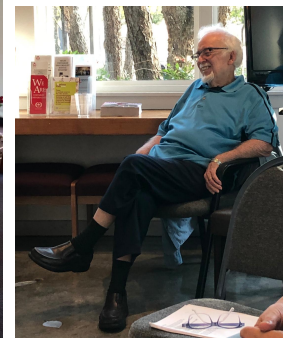
LAST MONTH'S HAPPENINGS***

Pedals for the Palm

The pedal steel guitar with its foot pedals and knee levers allows for amazing techniques at the hands and limbs of a skilled musician. This is not lost on guitar players who hold their instruments in their hands or laps. A German firm produces a device called the Duesenberg Multibender. Also Peters, maker of custom guitars, produces a lap steel guitar equipped with a multibender.

Duesenberg Multibender



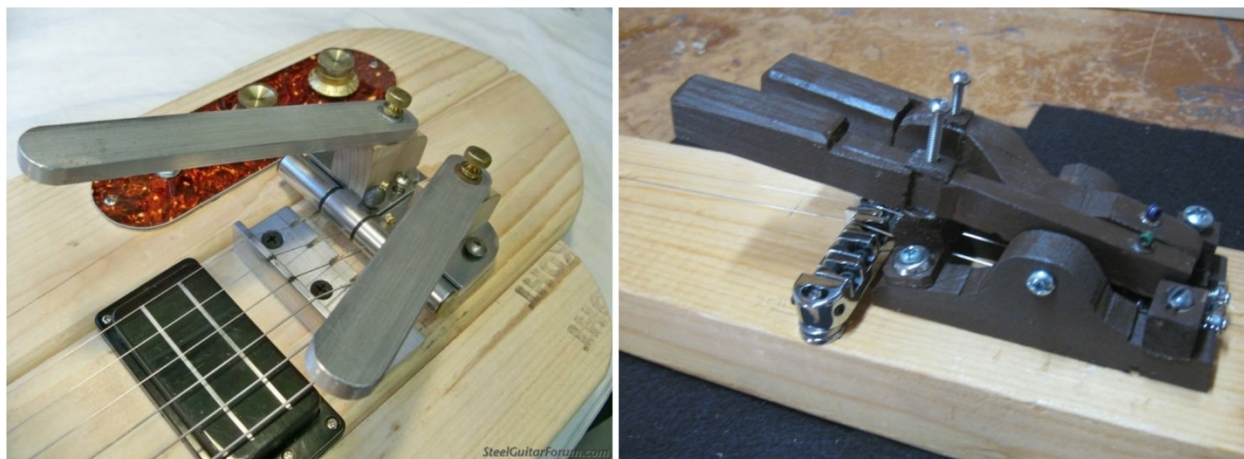
Peters Palm Pedal



Such equipment enables a skilled musician to emulate techniques of the pedal steel guitar. While one who plays a standard slide guitar or resonator must go from 1 position to 5 and 7 frets down the fretboard to play the I, IV & V chords, a guitar equipped with a bender can do this within two frets. Consider an open D tuning of D-A-D-F#-A-D. Palm pedal two bends the A one full step to B. This yields a Bm, the relative minor of D. Palm pedal one bends the F# one half step to G. Both pedals yield a D-G-B-D, a G chord or the IV chord. Move the bar two frets and you have an A chord, the V chord. Aside from efficient chord changes, a skilled musician can produce other melodious effects.

Of course, such technology can be pricey for many of us, the shade-tree musicians. However, with the help of Home Depot and the like, such musicians remain undaunted. Below (left) is fine example using a storm door hinge available at Home Depot for the heart of the bender. To the right is a proof of concept model fashioned by this writer from left over hardwood and some C B Gitty hardware. I am developing a four string cigar box model to make use of a bender.
