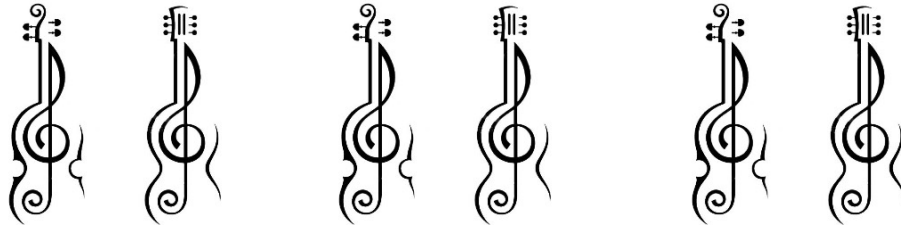

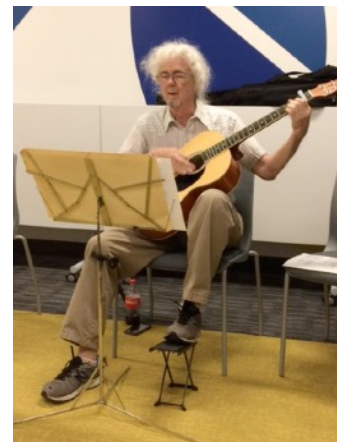

‘TIS NATURE’S NEED; ‘TIS GOD’S DECREE

The leaders of the Abolitionist movement set up anti-slavery singing circles and wrote special songs for them, generally set to the tune of old hymns. The best of them was this “Abolitionists Hymn” set to the familiar “Old Hundredth.”, which was published in the Genevan Psalter in 1551. John Pierpont wrote the lyrics as a poem in 1842. If you have ever accompanied a hymn singalong, you will know that many hymn tunes change chords just about every beat. This one is no exception, so don’t take it too fast. I have simplified the chords somewhat from the nice rendition by Stephen Griffith that can be found on Youtube at <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=72yrWCaoiY8>. "I'm in love, I'm in love with a beautiful girl, that's what the matter with me.."

His interpretation of "Lovesick Blues" was the best song of his repertoire. However, he not only sang country music, but also blues, rock, and traditional folk music, as well.

His name was Sam Sadler, but for reasons I never understood, his musical nickname was Uncle Sam. He bore no physical resemblance to the great mythological figure of the United States Army, because he was tall, dark, and handsome, with mellow black eyes, and teeth as white as marble, although somewhat crooked.

His voice was incredibly beautiful--rich, thick, vibrant, and above all, purely emotional, no matter what he sang. His instrumental ability was even better--his mandolin emitted sounds as sweet as wedding bells. His guitar style was energetic, but disciplined and elegant as well,

His paradox was that in spite of his talent, at times, he did not like to sing in public: "I don't like to play for rowdy, noisy people! They're brutes, and sometimes they make me nauseous! I don't understand why anybody would want to play for them!"

Sam was not a snob, but a performer of great artistic integrity. Unfortunately, he met a tragic end when he fell asleep at his steering wheel, and crashed over a bridge. However, at times, I still have visions of him when in our song we continue united by the same musical search for love.:

"And I'm lonesome,
I got the lovesick blues..."
