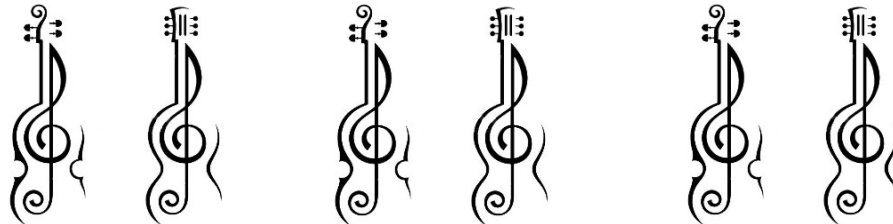

Bryan Bowers



As a child, Bryan would tag along with the field workers and gandy dancers around Petersburg, Virginia. There he learned to sing the old call-and-answer songs of work and life. He recalls, "The music I heard while working in the fields was mesmerizing. And I'd see the gandy Dancers coming down the tracks, setting the rails and getting their ties straight. You've heard that song, 'Whup Boys, Can't you line 'em? Was the call the leader would sing. Chack a lack was the bounce-back of the hammer after falling on the pin. I just thought that music was something that everyone did. It was years later that I realized what I'd been raised around."

Shortly after dropping out of Randolph Macon College three hours short of earning a degree in Spanish in the 1960s, Bryan took up the guitar and, shortly thereafter, the autoharp. "I ran into a guy that played several instruments and could get the harp in good tune. He played without any fingerpicks, just with his fingernails. He had a real sprightly style on it. It was the first time I'd heard someone play it in good tune and play it well. It opened my eyes and ears. I went out and got one the next day."

After recording many CDs and playing with just about everybody who is anybody in old-time music, Bryan was inducted in 1993 into the Autoharp Hall of Fame, along with Maybelle and Sara Carter and Kilby Snow. He has recently teamed up with Danny Knicely and Geoff Goodhue to form the Bryan Bowers Band, whose first Cd, ***Woodland Dream***, is available at <https://yhst-1309885141442.stores.yahoo.net/prpacdbrboba.html>

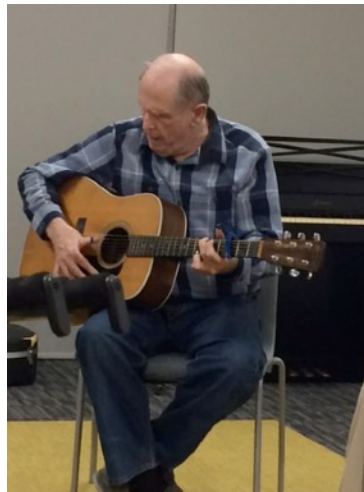
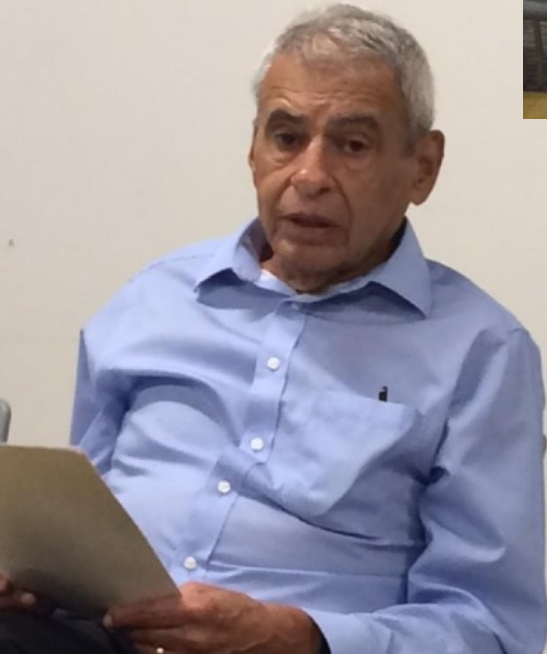
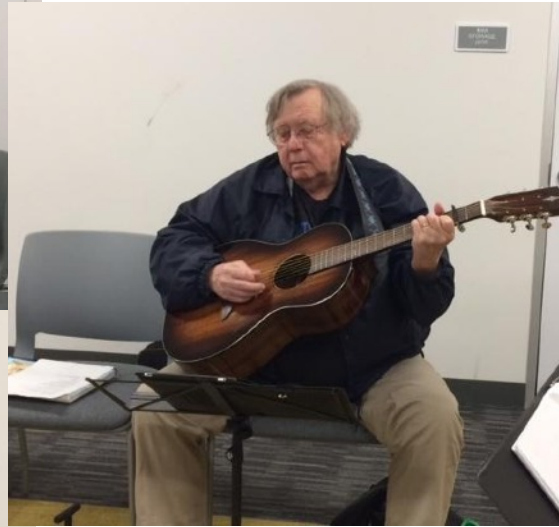

*** Review

Sometime back, I reviewed a book about Luckenbach and its imagineer, Hondo Crouch, by his daughter, Becky Crouch Patterson. However, even though I knew of the earlier book, "Hondo My Father," I never had read it. I finished the book, and it is a biographical masterpiece about Hondo's life and times, and how Luckenbach was created.

Becky tells of how Hondo, in his youth, became a swimming champion. However, if you really want to know of his prowess, check the back of the book containing a diary which he kept during his youth. I think this diary is worth the whole book by itself.

Besides being a raconteur and imagineer, he also sang rancheras, accompanying himself on the guitar. I wish I could find some videos of his playing, but I don't think they're available to the general public. Maybe Becky has some, but here again, I'm not sure.

His most famous recitation was "Luckenbach Moon," but he also did one on the Luckenbach sun as well. I don't think the latter was recorded, but I could be wrong.

I was most impressed by Hondo's agricultural genius. He knew how to work the land well.

He said, "Things that seem simple, aren't--when you look at them close up." I think that pretty well sums up Hondo Crouch's personality. He was one-of-a-kind, and we won't see his kind again. !Viva Luckenbach! !Viva Hondo!
