

On February 13, 1692, an estimated 30 members and associates of Clan MacDonald of Glencoe were killed by government forces for failing to pledge allegiance to the new monarchs, William III of Scotland and Mary II. The MacDonalds were Jacobites, participating in an uprising to restore James II to the throne. The government of William III sought to make a brutal example of them for all the Jacobites. This tactic worked; the uprising in the Highlands ended with the massacre of Glencoe.
