The **Houston Balalaika Orchestra** was founded in 1976. Currently under the direction of Pam Bingham, the orchestra performs throughout the Houston area an impressive repertoire of folk and semi-classical music from Russia and Eastern Europe, as well as the occasional popular or secular tune. The fire and grace of this unique music is always impressive, and leaves many audiences wondering how they missed being a fan of this incredible music for so long.

The **Kosher Klezmer Band** came together about 10 years ago, with members from several countries, including Israel, Bulgaria, Russia, Latvia, and yes, even Texas, to share their love of Klezmer music. The band performs traditional music from Eastern Europe, America, and Israel, and travels throughout Texas and the U.S. for weddings, Bar/Bat Mitzvahs, festivals, and private parties. I GOT A BIRD THAT WHISTLES, I GOT A BIRD THAT SINGS...

An expecting human mother may caress her belly and sing to her unborn child because of the love she has for her baby. Birds sing to their eggs, and for various reasons. In the case of birds that lay eggs of precocious hatchlings, born with their eyes open and covered in down that are able to move about, this is part of imprinting. The hatchlings can fend for themselves provided they keep close to their mother. In the case of birds that lay eggs of altricial hatchlings, born with their eyes closed and very helpless, there are other reasons. For Zebra finches, the songs of the mother heard within the egg,



prepares the hatchling for the seasonal temperature. This change is important when ambient temperatures are running high. For Fairy wren, it provides a life saving defense. The Fairy wren mother teaches her hatchlings by singing the call they need to learn for feeding time.

The Cuckoo, a parasitic bird, will lay its egg in another species nest. When the Cuckoo egg hatches, it is usually much larger than the native hatchling and will instinctively push the native bird out of the nest, and consequently be raised alone by the unsuspecting



mother bird. However, the Fairy wren will only feed the hatchlings that sing her song and thusly the parasitic hatchling will perish and not be a threat to her hatchlings.




